"They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3 but when they went in they did not find the body. 4 While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. 5 The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here but has risen." (Luke 24:2-5)

Greetings, as we celebrate the miracle of Easter and joy at knowing that we serve a Lord who lives. The passage above is my favorite telling of the resurrection stories because it makes that point very clear to the women. "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here but risen."

All too often, we tend to focus on the negative, to look for the worst in a situation, instead of seeing that at first what may look like a struggle really presents us with an opportunity for growth into something new and wonderful. This is the situation which the women faced on that first Easter morning. After all that had taken place Thursday and Friday, they now go to Jesus' grave and find his body missing. They are surely devastated and certain that someone has taken his body. They are so focused on the "bad" that they fail to recognize that angels are standing there with them. Angels who bring them great news. That Jesus has risen!

The angels challenge the women, calling them to recognize that at what seemed a reason for despair is really an opportunity to rejoice! That is what is an amazing thing about Easter. It brings to life that which was thought to be beyond saving. With the resurrection, we can know that regardless of what the world tried to accomplish, God brings life and good news.

May we celebrate this week and into the future that we will find Jesus among the living; that there is hope for the future, no matter what the world may throw at us; and that our loving and powerful God gives us hope, even when we are challenged to carry on.
