SUBJECT: Annual Report of the Old Brookville Police Department

The annual report on the activities of your police department is hereby submitted for the year 1985.

Statistics compiled herein reflect the volume and diversity of police business transacted throughout the year, and in particular, the increase or decrease in crime, auto accidents and other incidents. Index crimes reported, as required, to the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services and the National Crime Information Center, increased 20.6% over the previous year (1984), but most significant was a 35.7% increase in the number of burglaries committed over the previous year (1984) and 11.7% more than the number of burglaries recorded in our Five Village area during 1983. The number of Auto Accidents that occurred increased 17.3% over last year and the total of all categories of police service rendered increased 8.6%.

Although the demands on the police department for its services remain high, the members of the Force continue to respond promptly and effectively to all situations requiring police assistance. They have performed their duties efficiently and always in the best interests of the residents of the Five Villages.

All of you have been extremely patient and understanding of the many problems and difficulties we've faced and resolved during 1985. Therefore, I take this opportunity to express my sincere thanks and appreciation for the time and effort you've expended in all matters of mutual concern. Morale is high and our Police Department is better than ever before.
