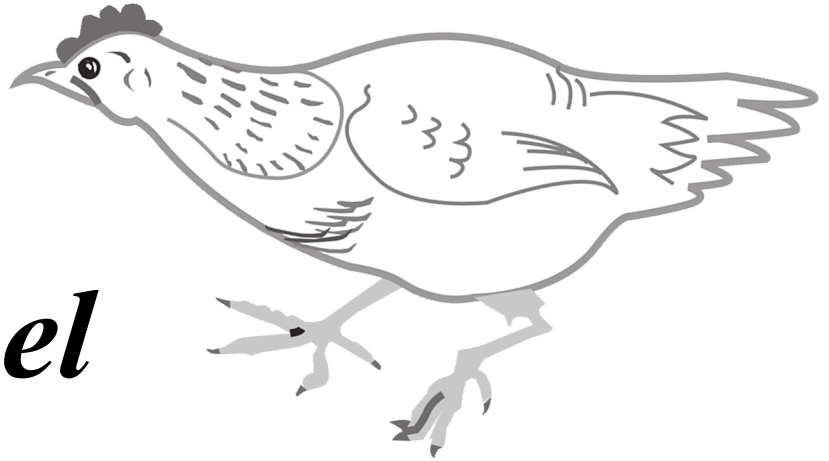


# Chicken Little: *The Sequel*
