Scotia-Glenville Food Pantry – We collect for the Scotia-Glenville Food Pantry, both food and cash, during service on the **second and fourth Sundays each month**. There are baskets in each corner of the sanctuary for food donations anytime. Cash will allow the food pantry to buy from the Regional Food Bank at reduced prices as well as those items they run short of. The pantry will use anything we donate but they always need personal hygiene products (soaps, shampoo, toilet paper, etc.) because people cannot purchase these items with food stamps.

Bottles for Bread — Please continue to place your clean **refundable** containers in the red barrels. If you have a large quantity, pick-up can be arranged. All proceeds go to the Scotia-Glenville food pantry.

Regional Food Bank – A great opportunity for fellowship with others from our church and a group from Bank of America. On the third Tuesday of each month we go to the Regional Food Bank to sort and repack products from various stores. We meet at the church to carpool at 2:00 and usually return there around 4:30. No long term commitment, join us whenever your schedule allows. Our next trip is **TUESDAY**, **April 21**.

Box Tops for Education - Box tops for education can be found on some cereal boxes, yogurt containers and numerous other containers. If you are not giving yours to a school, please drop them off at church and we will donate them to local schools.

Labels for Education – Similar to Box Tops for Education the Labels for Education are found on many packages. So if you are not using your labels, please consider bringing them to church. 31 Gifts Update - When I found out that foster children's belongings are moved in garbage bags, I was heartbroken. It must be very scary to be sent to live with strangers, but when your belongings are put into a garbage bag, it must be devastating.

I saw information about an organization that provides tote bags to kids in foster care. Knowing that Sarah Caterina is a representative for 31 Gifts, which sells beautiful bags, I suggested that she should get the company to provide bags to foster care kids. Sarah did this but she also took that kernel of an idea and it blossomed into a project that was embraced by church members.

Sarah generously matched each bag that was donated and on March 15th, we delivered 64 bags (64 bags!), filled with stuffed animals, fleece throws, pillowcases, toiletries and more to **Things of My Very Own** in Schenectady. They will provide our bags to children who are being placed on an emergency basis by **Schenectady County Child Protective Services**. We also delivered a very generous check and several large bags of clothing.

It was wonderful to work on this project. These bags will surely provide a bit of comfort to children in a crisis situation. Thank you for your generosity. We can all feel good about this.— Janet Daly
