What is Epiphany?

On Epiphany Sunday we had an opportunity during worship to come forward and receive a **Star Word**. These star words were construction paper cut into the shape of a star with a word on it. This is something that we are invited to meditate on this year. The words are not necessarily the words that we would choose for ourselves, but words that God wants us to hear. I have really been enjoying the feedback from people about their star word. Judy Matthews has told me that each Sunday she thinks of a new way to apply her star word in her life. I've found that my star word, encouragement, has been a blessing and a growing edge. I think that part of my job is to encourage you all to see the places the Holy Spirit has been at work in our church and in your lives, to encourage you to live out the

gifts that God has given you, to encourage you to follow Jesus and to be fishers of people.

But at home, I need to work on ways I can encourage my kids. Maybe it is just the stage that they are in, but I often feel all I am saying to my boys is "no." How can God use me to encourage my boys? How is God using this word for me to more fully live into the person God created me to be? I look forward to hearing how your star word has affected you, both the good and the difficult growing edges. If you were not there on Epiphany, don't worry, I have more star words. I'd ask that you place it somewhere that you will see it on a regular basis. In this season of Epiphany may we continue to have "Aha" moments, discovering who Jesus is to us and how our lives are different because of that revelation. -Pastor Megan
