What is Lent?

In the month of February we entered into a new season, the season of Lent. Lent is typically observed as a time of simple living, prayer and fasting that leads up to Easter and people usually "give up" something. The idea of giving up something came from Scripture. It came from modeling a Scripture, Matthew 4: 1-11, the story of Jesus retreating into the wilderness for 40 days to fast and pray before he began his ministry.

So what do we think happened during those forty days of fasting and praying in the wilderness? Some scholars say that maybe Jesus needed some time with God to sort through the major changes happening in his life. Maybe he needed a break from family, friends and his regular routine in order to see God [and himself] more clearly.

Maybe he sought more time with God as he searched for direction and answers to the question that we, too have from time to time: "God, what are you calling me to do?"

We too are invited into this time of introspection. As we journey through this season of Lent, some of us will choose to give up something. Some of us will choose to take on something. Some of us will choose to be more reflective. No matter what you choose to do, the idea behind Lent is to choose to do something that will bring you closer to God. May these forty days draw us nearer to God and neighbor, making us more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.
