#### **Year to Date**

\* Year to date Net Gain/Loss was worse than budget due primarily to a shortfall in fund raising and greater than budgeted church maintenance repairs.

#### YTD compared to Prior YTD

\* Net Gain/Loss for 2013 year to date was almost the same as the Net Gain/Loss for the prior year. 2013 included more revenue as well as more expenses than in 2012.

#### **Capital Campaign and Capital Spending**

- \* As of 11/30/13, there were \$34,953 of Capital Campaign Pledges yet to be paid including \$14,783 pledged to be received by year end 2013.
- \* A loan of \$35,000 was taken out by the church to allow the Trustees to go ahead with the Education Wing roof repair before all the pledges were paid. The loan payments are \$1,054 a month for three years. It is important that the pledges promised are paid in order for the church to pay off the loan.
