Capital Campaign Phase II Kickoff Announcement

Last year's Capital Campaign had a goal of \$150,000.00. We reached \$118,000.00 of that goal. **Much was accomplished with that \$118,000.00.** The major portion of the money went toward rebuilding the almost 60 year old roof on the Education Wing. But there were many other things that were done.

All the toilets in the downstairs bathrooms were replaced; new carpeting was installed on the steps and landings in the Community Room; new gutters and drains were placed over the Fireplace Room exit; new floor tiles for the upstairs and part of the downstairs hallways; new ceiling tiles in the upstairs hallway and especially new, and brighter, lighting in the Education Wing hallway. The Trustees had the outside of the church building re-pointed from the ground to the window levels all around the church. And, most recently completed was the welcome repair to the ceiling over the altar.

There is a great deal more to be accomplished. Including work on the church, there are some serious items that need to be addressed at the Parsonage.

Future Church Repairs Include:

- 1. New gutters have to be installed on the main body of the church.
- 2. Deteriorated coping stones have to be replaced to prevent water from coming in.
- 3. The rest of the church building needs to be re-pointed above the window levels and new flashing needs to be installed around the tower. That is why the back area of the sanctuary is roped off.
- 4. Plastering needs to be done throughout the church, especially on the Catherine Street wall, on the side balcony and in the Old Library upstairs over Reverend Megan's office.

The Trustee's estimate an additional cost of \$50,000.00 to \$100,000.00 to bring the church up to a level that can be maintained with annually budgeted "maintenance money."

The Capital Campaign Committee recently met and decided that we needed to institute Phase II of the Capital Campaign to complete the job.

Letters will be going out shortly to members of the church inviting everyone to participate in Phase II. And, we hope to have the results of Phase II of the Capital Campaign available on Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday. It will be a day of good news and rejoicing.

Thank you! We, and the Trustees, have a lot of work ahead of us in the coming year.
