Greetings Scotia United Methodist Church,

For those of you I haven't had the pleasure of meeting yet, please let me introduce myself. My name is Margaret Currier and I have been appointed by the Bishop of Upper New York Annual Conference to serve as your pastor. I come to you from Jonesville United Methodist Church where I served as Associate Pastor for the last two vears. Prior to serving at Jonesville I served as Student Pastor for the First United Methodist Church of Schenectady; as Mohawk Youth Cluster Coordinator for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA); and as the UMC Regional Youth Director for the Greater Schoharie area in the Oneonta District of Upper New York Annual Conference. Before answering my call to ministry I was self employed and worked professionally as an Actors Equity Association (A.E.A.) Production Stage Manager for various arts organizations in Washington, D.C., the area my husband, Rob, and I moved to after receiving our Bachelor Degrees from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts. In 2001, we moved back to the northeast to attend graduate school. Rob received his Master's degree from UAlbany and I graduated with my Master of Divinity from the Theological School at Drew University.

I spent the first part of my childhood living in Lenox, Massachusetts with my younger brother, mother, and father and the later part of my youth living in Picayune, Mississippi with my younger brother, mother, step-father, two step-brothers. Upon graduation from high school in 1989, I joined the U.S. Army National Guard and after graduation from boot camp and advanced individual training I moved back to Massachusetts to begin my studies at Berkshire Community College.

I became a member of the United Methodist Church over 25 years ago at the First United Methodist Church of Picayune, MS where I actively participated in youth group attending spiritual retreats held throughout the Southern United States from Lake Junaluska, NC to the Colorado Mountains and choir tours that traveled anywhere from the mountains of Georgia to the panhandle of Florida.

As an adult, I have been very active in the life of the church serving the conference as a Co-Convener for the Critical Questions Team, the district as an Equalization member, and in the local church as a member of the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee, Worship Committee, and Chair of Safe Sanctuaries.

Currently I serve the conference as a member of the Worship Committee for the Annual Conference gathering; and when I'm not serving as your pastor, I serve as a New Faith Communities planter, an exciting new initiative of the Upper New York Annual Conference. Ask me about it!

I currently reside in the village of Castleton-on-Hudson, NY with my husband Robert and three children, Everett, Andrew, and Rebecca. We look forward to making the transition to the church parsonage and the Scotia community very soon and want to give our heartfelt thanks to everyone who is helping to make this transition possible.

Also, a thank you to all who have attended service this past month for wearing your name tags, it helps me put a name with a face and get to know you better. My family and I have enjoyed worshiping with our new church family over the last few weeks and are very excited to explore what ministries God is calling us to do in the upcoming year.
