February Month

- February income was greater than budget due primarily to individual contributions.
- * February expenses were better than budget due primarily to \$960 positive variance for Church snow plowing. Only \$280 was spend on Church snow plowing in January.
- * Church utilities were \$666 better than budget.

February Year to Date

- * Year to date income was less than budget primarily due to the timing of receiving individual contributions and to the Flame concert budgeted for February instead of March.
- * Year to date expenses were better than budget due primarily to a \$1,546 positive budget variance for Church utilities and a \$2,225 positive budget variance for church snow plowing.

February YTD compared to the prior YTD

- * Operating income YTD was \$2,986 less than for the same period last year. Individual contributions received were \$2,305 less than for January and February last year. This was primarily due to the timing of the receipt of the contributions. There were nine Sundays in January and February last year and only eight Sundays in January and February in 2013. March will be a five Sunday month in 2013.
- * Expenses YTD were \$1,606 less than for January and February last year primarily due to \$1,225 in Church roof repairs last year and apportionments less in 2013 by \$400 YTD.
- * The net loss YTD was \$1,380 worse than last year primarily due to fewer Sundays in January and February compared to last year.
