

Good News for the New Year

I am so excited to share some good news!!! Nancy Karm, our treasurer, shared that we ended 2012 in the black. What does that mean exactly? We took in more money than we spent and had a bit left over. For the past several years, there had been a trend of receiving less pledges and rental money than what we spent on salaries, ministries and missions, building maintenance, electric and plowing. There had been several generous bequests that we lived off of as well as using our savings to stay afloat. To paint an even brighter picture, the 2013 stewardship campaign was successful thanks in a large part to Ken Handy, our stewardship chair. We have pledges of over \$124,000, a 40% increase over just two years ago. Does this mean that there is new or more money? Possibly. Possibly some people who had not pledged in the past finally wrote down what financial contribution they were able to give to God through this congregation, which is also a

positive step. If you have not yet pledged and were considering it, please do.

We balanced the 2013 budget by putting in money for renting the facilities, a grant from the Upper New York Conference and fundraising that we may or may not receive. We are on a positive upswing. Crunching the numbers of people in the pews, we had approximately 85 people in church each Sunday (that includes our nursery care attendant and the children in the nursery as well as the people in the pews, liturgist, organist and pastor). brought a check over to the Scotia Glenville Food Pantry in January for \$600 to support the needy in our own neighborhoods. God is doing amazing things in and through our congregation! I cannot wait to see what is next. Blessings, Pastor Megan

Note: Budget change-The \$10k Grant budget spread over 12 months instead of 6 months. Hence, the budget variance for the month changes but not for the whole year.

December Month

- * December income was greater than budget due to a Five Sunday month and Christmas donations offset by a fund raising shortfall of \$1,383.
- * December expenses were better than budget due primarily to \$935 positive variance for Church utilities.

December Year to Date

- Great news. The church broke even for the year.
- * Income year to date is short of budget due to the less than expected grant money of \$1,350, building use rent shortfall of \$4,067, fundraising shortfall of \$2,590 partially offset by greater than budgeted individual contributions of \$5,098.
- * Year to date expenses are positive to budget due primarily to church heating and snow plowing savings partially offset by church roof and parsonage repairs.

December Year to Date Compared to Prior Year to Date

- * Individual giving year to date is \$8,365 over last year. Building use revenue is \$6,743 less than last year due to the loss of the Nursery School revenue.

 Conference grant money is \$1,350 less than last year. In total, income was \$352 over last year. \$1,900 of the Individual contributions were to cover the unbudgeted parking lot seal coating and sign replacement.
- * Expenses year to date are less than the prior year by \$6,470 primarily due to decreased apportionments of \$2,847, lower church property related expenses of \$2,332 and no pastor move related expense in 2012.
