
Youth Group Bowling on January 30th

A Piece of History from Holly Russo

Twenty years ago, shortly after Ellen and I started coming to SUMC, we saw a notice in the bulletin about something called Hanging of the Greens. Mom sent me down to find out what it was all about. I walked into a beehive of activity, all under the direction of a tiny woman named Etta Poulin, who was Worship Chairman. Live greens were being cut up, tied up and hung up. The railing had pine boughs woven in between the bars and decorated with artificial poinsettia. Etta gave me a job and not long after she came up to me and told me that she'd been watching and decided she was giving the decorating job to me so it would be one last hat she had to wear. We had live trees, so tall that you needed the big ladder to reach the top for the lights and decorations. Back then, those very special decorations were only handled by certain people and to be chosen was deemed an honor by the guardians of the ornaments.

Members were hosting refreshments in the Fireside Room and in the Loomis Room, kids were making Advent wreaths, ornaments and Advent logs. We all went downstairs together for a potluck dinner and then back up for a concert put on by the children with dessert after in the Fireside Room. Two seasons later, we went to artificial greens to make clean up a bit easier. We still had live trees but the mess was only in one spot. I remember when Jim Farrell, our Interim Pastor and his wife Ruth came to this event. Jim took his chair and faced it into the sanctuary so he could see everything.

The Hanging of the Greens as a day of celebrating Advent ended after the first Holiday on the Avenue. Attendance had dwindled and we started the Open House instead. Due to expense of heating and the possibility of weather conditions, we chose not to participate this year in the Open House event.

I'm sorry that all these events have ended but times change and we move on. Two things have not changed: my enjoyment of decorating the church with my crew, and Kim and Dave Huhtala creating very innovative and beautiful centerpieces for the "birthday party" they put on between services on Christmas Eve, even serving an actual birthday cake as a reminder as to why we really celebrate this very special holiday.

away the Christmas trees and the white
poinsettias.
