
#### The Book of Discipline & The Book of Resolutions

Besides the worship and fellowship opportunities at General Conference, there is the important work of reshaping *The Book of Discipline* and *The Book of Resolutions*. There are approximately 1400 petitions, many of which are similar in nature that need to looked at, perfected, approved, tabled or rejected. Pages work long hours during the 10 days and many stay to watch parts of the conference when they are not working (I found it hard to pull myself away and made a point to celebrate Holy Communion every day with Bishops). It is also a good time to network with members of our new Upper NY Conference and to celebrate the diversity of the Connection.

What I brought back from my two previous visits to General Conference was an appreciation for the World-wide nature of our Denomination, new music and creative visuals to help set the stage for worship, my beautiful quilted stoles, friendships with many clergy and laity throughout the world, a desire to bring important programs such as Nothing But Nets to my congregation, to share information about what the Women's Division is doing to our local UMW group and to prepare the congregation for how some of the legislation passed will affect our local church going forward. I attended the past two General Conferences (2004 & 2008), which have been both the hardest and best learning about what it means to be church. I cannot wait to go back!

#### March Month

- \* March income was \$3,550 short of budget due primarily to a negative variance related to the equitable compensation grant. This was budgeted at the same level as we received in 2011, however, we are receiving \$1,058 less per month than last year.
- March collections for the Food Pantry were \$143.08 and \$474 has been collected year to date.
- \* March expenses were \$2,118 better than budget due primarily to positive warm weather related church heating and snow plowing expense variances.
- \* The March loss variance was \$1,432 worse than budget.

#### Year to Date

- \* Income year to date is short of budget primarily due to the less than expected grant money of \$3,175 YTD.
- \* Year to date expenses are positive to budget due primarily to \$4,595 church heating and snow plowing savings offset by church and parsonage roof repairs.
- \* The expenses are usually greater than income the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter. Income is pretty steady throughout the year, however, the expenses are highest 1<sup>st</sup> quarter due to heating, snow plowing and annual maintenance contracts.

#### **Comparison to Last Year**

- \* The 2012 income YTD was \$1,768 better than 2011 income despite \$2,612 less Building Use income in 2012
- \* The 2012 YTD expenses were \$4,858 less than the 2011 due to the warm weather related expense savings.
- \* Overall, the church has done better year to date by \$6,626 this year as compared to last year.
