On May 26, we celebrate **Peace with Justice Sunday**, one of six special offerings in the United Methodist Church. Your **Peace with Justice Sunday** gifts change lives in places where the joy of knowing Christ is mixed with the tragedy of violence. United Methodists relate to this special Sunday by seeking peaceful solutions, creating and supporting peace-related ministries in their conference and learning about peaceful, just efforts around the world. It aids disciples, young and old, who are indeed changing lives and changing the world, inspired by Christ's gospel of love and liberation. One such example is helping people in the Congo to go through reconciliation after the recent Civil War.

We are a diverse group of pastors and laity representing all five of our jurisdictions in the United States, from Iowa, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, New York, Oklahoma, Washington State, Texas, Wyoming and Louisiana. It was an honor to be chosen as a guinea pig site.

Over 70 youth and adults from all over New England will stay in our church home and work throughout Scotia, Rotterdam, and Schenectady to assist people in yard work, painting, & building handicap accessible ramps. March Month

- * March income was greater than budget due primarily to individual contributions. March was a five Sunday month and was budgeted more like a four Sunday month.
- * March expenses were worse than budget primarily due to the \$984 church furnace boiler condensate pump repair.

March Year to Date

- * Year to date income was greater than budget primarily due to individual contributions offset by a building use rent shortfall of \$545.
- * Year to date expenses were better than budget due primarily to a \$1,747 positive budget variance for Church utilities and a \$2,030 positive budget variance for church snow plowing services offset by a \$1,069 negative budget variance for church repair.

March YTD compared to Prior YTD

- * Operating income YTD was \$1,481 greater than for the same period last year due to individual contributions. YTD thru March, there were 13 Sundays in both 2012 and in 2013.
- * Expenses March YTD were more than March YTD last year primarily due to church utilities costing \$778 greater than last year and the purchase of a new computer costing \$218 to replace the ailing church office computer.

Capital Spending

- * Great news!! Insurance covered all but the \$1,000 deductible for the new parsonage boiler thanks to Clarence Mosher's tireless efforts in dealing with the insurance company. The parsonage furnace boiler had cracked and stopped working and therefore needed to be replaced..
- * Efforts have begun to work on the church capital campaign related projects commencing with a 10% \$400 payment to the architect who had been hired to design the replacement roof over the education wing.
