Missions

Scotia-Glenville Food Pantry -As you know, we collect for the Scotia-Glenville Food Pantry, both food and cash, during service on the second and fourth Sundays each month. There are baskets in each corner of the sanctuary for food donations anytime. Cash will allow the food pantry to buy from the Regional Food Bank at reduced prices as well as fresh items and those items they run short of. The pantry will use anything we donate but they can always use peanut butter, jellies, juices, pasta sauces and pasta.

Regional Food Bank - A great opportunity for fellowship with others from our church and a group from Bank of America. On the second Tuesday of each month we go to the Regional Food Bank to sort and repack products from various stores. We meet at the church to carpool at 2:00 and usually return around 4:30. No long term commitment, join us whenever your schedule allows. Our next trip is TUESDAY, September 13th. Bible Studies in the Fall

The Tuesday morning Bible Study will continue to use the 2011 Disciplines through the month of September and when we gather together, we will come up with a plan for October and November. The first meeting will be Sept. 13th at 9:30 am.

The evening Bible Study will start on Thursday, Sept. 15th at 7 pm. Before the actual study will be an organizational meeting on Thurs. Sept. 8th at 7 pm. We will be looking at the book, "What's the Least I Can Believe and Still Be a Christian?" by Martin Thielen. The book costs \$11. Please check with Pastor Megan for the book and for more information. This book study will allow us to discuss several things Christians don't need to believe. For example, we don't need to believe that Christians don't doubt or that it is ok for Christians to be judgmental and obnoxious. However, we will spend most of our time studying what Christians do need to believe (in Jesus-his life, teachings, example, death and resurrection). A great benefit to these beliefs is that they provide promising answers to some of life's most profound questions, including: What matters most? Am I accepted? Where is God? What about suffering? And is there hope?

Sunday School Updates

We are still in need of a few volunteers to be teachers. We know that the education of our children and youth is critical so we ask that you please consider volunteering, even if only for a few Sundays between now and Christmas. We will be holding a confirmation class for students 8th grade and older. Confirmation class is a time in which we really wrestle with the questions of what does it mean to be Christian? Why would we want to be United Methodist? Why become a member of Scotia United Methodist Church?

We are doing a fundraiser to purchase our Sunday School curriculum and supplies. In the hallway will be a giant backpack. We will be encouraging people to fill up our backpack with mini-book bags (which represent a share of the Sunday School expenses). You can buy a mini-book bag during Coffee Hour starting on September 4th.

We are re-vamping the Safe Sanctuaries Policy so that our children and volunteers are safer and the church is less at risk. This means if you have a child who attends Sunday School or is in the nursery, we will have a registration form for you to fill out, alerting us of any medical conditions that we need to be aware of including your contact information in case we need to get a hold of you during the week.

Our Fall Sermon Series will focus on one of the most foundational items of our faith, the Apostle's Creed. These scholarships enable people around the world to serve and lead their home churches and communities by making higher education a reality.

From the Pastor

As we passed out name tags recently, I heard a lot of people mention, "oh, but we're not members here." So I would like to invite you to be officially united with this community. I will be glad to let you know what our church is all about. You may join by transferring from another congregation or by making a Profession of Faith (if you have never been baptized or joined a church before.) You may join by Reaffirmation of Faith. This means you were a member of a church at one time but you fell out of the habit of church. You may ask, "Why should I bother joining a church? I'm not into organized religion." I hear you. If it helps, we are mostly disorganized.

I understand joining a church doesn't provide you with many worldly benefits. Members get to vote at charge conferences and they can be elected to our Staff Parish Relations committee (the church's human resources dept). For most, that may not be much of a prize. Many folks participate and have done so for years without actually joining. You don't have to be a member to be involved in our activities.

But those who take the plunge often do so because they believe in what we are doing and want to stand with us. We encourage and support people who are involved in peacemaking, human rights, and environmental and economic justice. We encourage and support people who are involved in repairing homes, preparing meals, and healing bodies. We aren't looking for folks just to get them on our membership rolls. We are looking for folks who, having found a home here, are ready to roll up their sleeves and work with us, take off their shoes and dance with us, let loose their inhibitions and sing with us, and put on their hiking boots and explore creation with us!

It doesn't matter if you have been attending for a few Sundays or for a few decades, we'd be happy to talk with you to see if this is the right step for you. It is an easy process to join. If you are interested in discussing this, I would be happy to arrange a time to meet with you. We will have new member conversations soon and those who decide to join will be introduced to the congregation so we can celebrate with them. Let me know if you are ready to jump in with both feet and take the bull by the horns!

This workshop is for pastors, small group leaders and potential small group leaders. It is based on the ChristCare system of small group leadership with a strong influence from the Saddleback small group system. The goal of the workshop is that:

- 1. Pastors will go back to their church and set up a small group system that will result in many holistic small groups. We believe that a good small group system is essential for the creation of holistic small groups and those holistic small groups are an essential aspect of a healthy church of any size.
- 2. Each lay person trained will confidently go home and recruit, organize and lead a holistic small group.

Dan and Karen Finch have been small group leaders for many years and have been leading small group leader workshops for the past five years throughout the northeast. Dan is the pastor of the United Methodist Church of Livonia. Karen is an author and faculty member of RIT.
